
# LSMCE BP DL



2 Projected Change in the Number of High-School Graduates, 2004-5 to 2014-15




### Impact Reports

The Louis Stokes Alliances for Minority Participation (LSAMP) Impact Report Viewer Application (IRVA) for reporting years of 1992-2012 is a prototype application developed by GOH in support of LSMCE national dissemination objectives. The application allows for easy distribution, navigation, and viewing of program- and project-level impacts by grantees, policy makers, and other program stakeholders. The application automatically executes a short introductory presentation and then brings users to a map of the U.S. You can then click on different states to view a listing of Impact Reports produced by Alliances within that region, and select specific Alliance Impact Reports to view. The IRVA also includes a menu where users can select and browse additional historical documents, such as program impact data and seminal reports. Participation (LSAMP) consortium to a broader audience. LSMCE will serve as a national hub of information for scholars to access data, models, and funding opportunities in broadening participation of underrepresented minority (URM) students in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM). Additionally, the Center will begin assisting 28 Midwestern non-LSAMP schools with developing strategies to improve their URM students' performance, persistence and success in STEM degree programs and provide opportunities for their faculty and students to participate in STEM activities including workshops/conferences, webinars and research internships.

The Center activities will be concentrated in areas of information dissemination and outreach. Its goal is to strengthen the recruitment and retention of URM students through mentoring and providing support to ease the transitional challenges at critical educational junctures. It also aims to help URM students move forward to degree completion and career advancement in STEM fields. This will be done in three ways.

1. Taking a leadership role to articulate the national critical need for broadening minority participation and success in STEM undergraduate programs.

2. Developing an information hub that provides consistent on-line resources and sustained opportunities to show case best practices in STEM teaching/learning and to support URM students' persistence and engagement through research and internship experiences.

3. Establishing the LSMCE hub to disseminate information and create networks of support for non-LSAMP students.
